



Every hour of every day, hundreds of people need essential human services. 2-1-1 assists people in connecting with those services.

2-1-1 Utah is a statewide service of United Way. 2-1-1 is an easy-to-remember, *free*, phone number that people can dial (24/7) to get information and referrals to important health, human, and community service programs including: emergency food pantries, utility/rental assistance, public health clinics, child care and parenting resources, employment assistance, addiction recovery programs, domestic violence or suicide crisis intervention, affordable housing options, help for aging parents, support groups, legal aid, and a variety of nonprofit and government agencies. Individuals, families, and corporate and religious groups can also dial 2-1-1 to get connected to meaningful volunteer opportunities.

In addition to Information and Referral Specialists, the 2-1-1 call center also has Health Care Specialists that can help people choose and enroll in health care plans, Child Development Specialists that can help parents find resources, get parenting tips, and do free developmental screenings, and 2-1-1 takes public information calls in a disaster or epidemic. 2-1-1 takes the Special Needs Registry calls for the state, and schedules most of the free VITA tax assistance appointments.

2-1-1 is easily accessed by phone, text, online chat, or email. The 2-1-1 database can also be searched on the 211 Utah app or website. Calls are free and confidential. Trained Information Specialists assess situations, make appropriate referrals, and monitor the needs of our communities. Interpreters are available in 170 languages. In 2016, over 100,000 Utahans called United Way 2-1-1 seeking assistance.

We are available 24 hours per day - 365 days per year.
