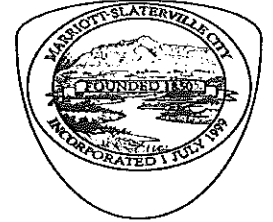

Late Winter Gardening

Late winter and early spring can be a time to get a good start on yard and garden work. Co-operative weather can allow you to do the following:

1. Prune fruit and shade trees and shrubs, avoid sensitive woody plants.
 2. Cut perennials down, but avoid plants such as Lavender and perennial grasses, which are cold sensitive.
 3. Start on the south of your home and move to east, then west. The north may still be wet and frozen.
 4. Do some general clean-up around plants and trees, like removal of grass that has crept in.
 5. For new trees/shrubs make sure soil is workable, obtain a soil sample from the Extension Office on the Fair Grounds.
 6. Providing the soil is dry enough and you have an area prepared, you can plant pansies and some perennials.
 7. When choosing plants, note size, soil and light requirements.

West Davis Corridor

As part of the recent refinements to the WDC alternatives, the study team has recently updated the Farmington interchange concept designs at both Shepard Lane and Glovers Lane. The map of alternatives for the Farmington/Kaysville area has also been updated to reflect these interchanges. These maps can be found on the project website, www.udot.utah.gov/westdavis. In the coming months, the study team will continue analyzing and refining the alternatives in greater detail. The results of this analysis will be reported in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), which will be available for public comment and

at public hearings in summer 2012. A final decision on a preferred alternative is expected summer 2013.
