Remember no parking on any roads between midnight and 7:00 AM between December 1 and March 1, during a snowstorm, and seventy-two (72) hours after a snowstorm. This is so the snow plows can operate. Violators will be towed. The most traveled roads are plowed first. Subdivisions and lesser traveled roads are plowed last. Property owners with sidewalks are responsible to remove snow from the sidewalk within twenty-four (24) hours after a snowstorm.
